

Common Name: Lavender, Blue Star

Botanical Name: *Lavandula stoechas* 'Blue Star'



Zone: 8 – 9

Type: Herbaceous perennial

Height: 18 – 24 in.

Width: 12 – 18 in.

Habit: Mounding

Flower: Deep violet-blue flowers with petals that elegantly rise above like butterfly wings.

Bloom Season: July – Sept.

Foliage: Silvery

Fragrance: Very fragrant

Sun: Full sun to partial shade



Soil: Well-drained, sandy-gravelly, alkaline

Water: Dry-medium



Tolerant: Drought, heat, deer., wind



Uses: Great for drying, potpourri, herb garden, fragrance garden, containers, borders

Attracts: Bees, birds, butterflies, hummingbirds



Harvesting: Cut flower spikes or strip flowers from stems just as blossoms show color; dry in a cool, shaded place.

Note: Mulch with rock, no organic mulches please.
