

Common Name: Lavender, Goodwin Creek

Botanical Name: *Lavandula heterophylla* 'Goodwin Creek'



Zone: 7 - 9

Type: Herbaceous perennial

Height: 24 – 36 in.

Width: 18 – 24 in.

Habit: Upright, bushy

Flower: Deep purple

Bloom Season: Early summer to early fall

Foliage: Silver-grey toothed foliage

Fragrance: Very fragrant

Sun: Full sun



Soil: Well-drained, sandy-gravelly, alkaline



Water: Dry-medium

Tolerant: Drought, heat, humidity, wind, deer

Garden Uses: border, great in containers and can be overwintered indoors, cut flower, dried flower, drought tolerant, fragrant.

Other Uses: Potpourri, sachets, flower arrangements

Harvesting: For sachets & potpourris, cut flower spikes or strip flowers from stems just as blossoms show color; dry in a cool, shaded place. Leaves can be stripped & used fresh or dried. Essential oils are extracted via steam distillation.

Attracts: Bees, butterflies
