

Common Name: Lavender, Kew Red

Botanical Name: *Lavandula stoechas* 'Kew Red'



Zone: 8 – 11

Type: Herbaceous perennial

Height: 12 – 24 in.

Width: 12 – 18 in.

Habit: Mounding

Flower: Red-violet with light pink bracts

Bloom Season: July – Sept.

Foliage: Gray-green with short compact leaves

Fragrance: Very fragrant

Sun: Full sun to partial shade



Soil: Well-drained, sandy-gravelly, alkaline



Water: Dry-medium



Tolerant: Drought, heat, deer., wind

Uses: Great for in containers; drying, potpourri, herb garden, fragrance garden, containers, borders

Attracts: Bees, birds, butterflies, hummingbirds



Harvesting: Cut flower spikes or strip flowers from stems just as blossoms show color; dry in a cool, shaded place.



Note: Mulch with rock, no organic mulches please. Shearing back faded blooms promotes reblooming.
