
Common Name: Chives, Onion Botanical Name: Allium schoenoprasum



- **Zone**: 4-8
- Type: Bulbous perennial
- Height: 1-1.5 ft.
- Width: 1-1.5 ft.
- Habit: Upright, mounding
- **Flower**: Globular, clover-like, purple
- Bloom Season: April-May
- **Foliage:** Thin, tubular, grass-like, dark green leaves
- Flavor: Mild onion-like flavor
- Fragrance: Onion
- Sun: Full sun to partial shade
- Soil: Average, well-drained
- Water: Medium
- Tolerant: Drought, black walnut, deer
- Attracts: Bees
- Uses: Add leaves to salads, soups, vegetables &sauces to add mild onion flavor. Use flower heads as a garnish in soups & salads. Use in herb gardens & as a border
- **Harvesting:** Clip leaves off at base of plant. Clip flower stem off at base, then remove the stem.
