

Common Name: Geranium, Scented 'Gray Lady Plymouth'

Botanical Name: *Pelargonium graveolens* var.



Zone: 9

Type: Tender perennial

Height: 24in.

Habit: Rounded if kept manicured

Flower: lavender or pink flowers

Bloom Season: May to July

Foliage: large, deeply divided light grey-green leaves that are edged in white

Fragrance: light rose scent 

Sun: Partial shade

Soil: Sandy to loamy well-drained soil

Water: Medium  

Garden Uses: Ornamental, fragrance garden, containers

Medicinal Uses: Antibacterial, aromatherapy, astringent, tonic

Over wintering: Keep inside from fall to spring in a cool basement or other similar location. Water them sparingly! Trim the plants back to base in fall (or in spring). This will encourage the plant to grow back nicely.
